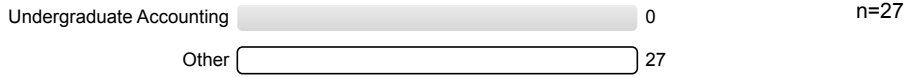

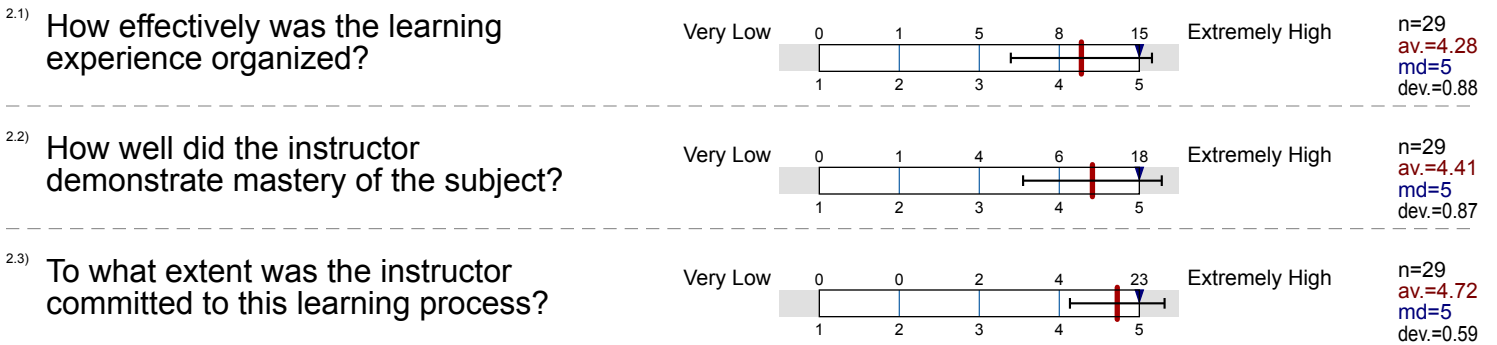

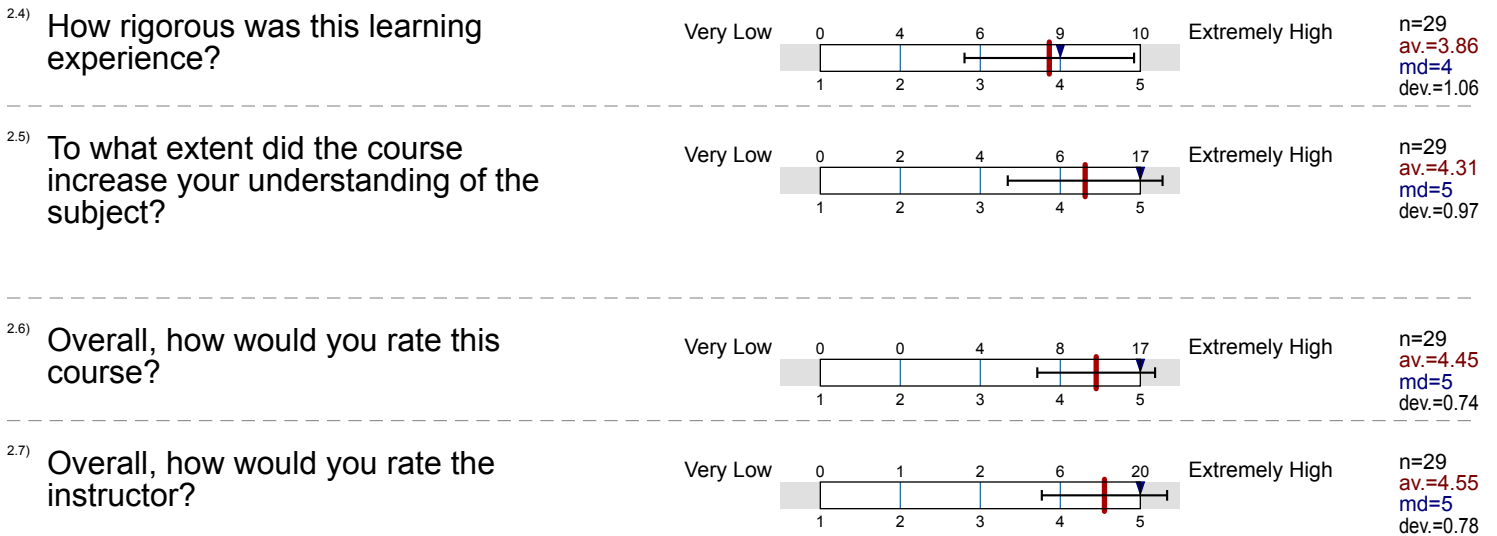

3.1) Comments to the instructor of this course:

- An absolutely great guy who cares about his students and really wants them to grow as a person as opposed to just taking tests and memorizing material. I love how focused he is on real world learning that can be applied directly to life post graduation.
- Coach Weinhaus clearly cares about his students and wants to make sure that he provides the best opportunity for us to learn. This class wasn't necessarily a traditional course in the case that we were learning more about leadership/work ethic traits that can be applied in our internships/future work. Overall, Coach Weinhaus made this course enjoyable and I always felt welcomed to class.
- Coach Weinhaus is hands down the best instructor that I have had in a long time. His course material makes the content interesting and worth learning about. Since UCLA has transitioned to an online format, I have found that this is one of the only classes that has been extremely useful.
- Coach Weinhaus is one of the best instructors I have ever had. I appreciate that it's open ended but more description of "forward looking" and suggestions of topics to write about for 9 pages would be helpful, just to ensure we aren't off-topic. I would also say that I spent a lot of time figuring out exactly how many assignments were necessary, so perhaps a summary table in the syllabus would be super helpful (I was confused on the 4 syllabus assignments but that it was only 3 of my choice). I think the diversity discussion was really interesting and liked how it encouraged everyone to see the concept of diversity from more than just the typical perspective/definition. I also think that there should be a way to get a tiny bit more credit/substitute an assignment by working extra internship hours, as I was working 18 hours on my internship, and as useful as most of the assignments were, my workload in my internship was far more valuable in my use of time. The 3 different simulation due dates were a pain as the first one was less than 2 days after the last class ended which forced me to move around my schedule to fit a group zoom in. Appreciate getting out of class early!
- Great class and loved that he incorporated two types of assignments - one for personal development and the other for professional development
- I really enjoyed this class, but the only thing I would change would be giving more concrete instructions for certain tasks such as the Simulation or the final presentation. Other than that, the class was rigorous without taking over my schedule and taught me a lot about how to make the most of my internship, and gave me strategies I can apply in my career.
- I think the course content was interesting. Like the professor, I did not really see a point in the simulations completed in this course. I really valued the internship chapter, but I sometimes felt like the material that the professor was covering did not really connect with the entrepreneurship minor. I thought the Q/A portion of asking for help for the internship was a resourceful part of the class.
- I thought that Coach Weinhaus was very professional and passionate in teaching this class. I liked that he shared personal anecdotes and used unconventional ways to teach us not only business but also career concepts. The assignments in particular were well thought out in the way that it helps students to make the most of our internship experiences.
- It was really nice to have a course that felt like it was very applicable to the real world I would be entering upon graduation. I liked having time to discuss internship problems and I liked going over the homework because it made it feel like it actually mattered if we did it or not, and that the professor really was taking time to read it and help. I do feel some of the references to religion were unnecessary and didn't seemed like they really fit with the class. All in all, it was a good experience and Coach seemed to really care about our learning experience.

I definitely enjoyed the internship aspect, but this class added unnecessary work that did not enhance my experience.
